Ashcroft Urgent Primary Care Centre offers urgent care with 4 emergency beds a long-term care with 24 extended care beds and 1 respite bed. A full range of outpatient and ambulatory care services are available including basic radiology, laboratory, dietitian/diabetes, mental health and addictions, public health, home health and adult day care. The nearest major medical centre for community transfer is Royal Inland Hospital in Kamloops.

The UPCC is conveniently co-located in the facility adjacent to the Long Term Care unit. It is spacious with a bright waiting room, four doctor's offices, eight exam rooms, a nurse's room, staff room and reception/ bookkeeping offices.

// CASTLEGAR & DISTRICT HEALTH CENTRE

Castlegar and District Community Health Centre offers a variety of services in one location. The types of services delivered depend on patient needs and on whether comparable services are available nearby. Centres that offer one type of specialized outpatient care procedure (such as eye surgery) are classified based on that service.

Community Health Centres do not have acute care beds, but may provide: basic laboratory and radiology; urgent care; outpatient ambulatory care; community services; long term residential care services; and/or onsite doctors' offices.

The Invermere & District Hospital (IDH) is a unique facility in that all healthcare services across the continuum of care are under one roof, providing for a very cohesive approach to patient care. The hospital is a level 1 community hospital with a very busy state of the art, well functioning 12 bed Emergency Department.

Invermere and District Hospital was built in 1991 and the Columbia House Residential Care was added in 1994 and then later expanded to 35 beds in 2005. A new public/private share residential care, Ivy House, has recently been built in the next block.

The Lillooet District Hospital (LDH) is a six-bed community hospital providing standard and emergency medical services 24-hours per day.

Additional services include Maternity Care, Medical Imaging (X-ray, Electrocardiogram, Holter Monitoring), Laboratory, Day Surgeries, Dietician/Diabetes Educator, Mental Health and Addictions, Alcohol and Drug Counseling, Home and Community Care, Home Support, Residential Care, Palliative Care and Respite Care.

Attached to the hospital is the 22 bed Mountain View Lodge Residential Care Facility.

// ARROW LAKES HOSPITAL

The Arrow Lakes Hospital (ALH) is a Level 1 Community Hospital. The hospital has 6 acute care beds, 20 extended care beds and a well equipped, fully functioning emergency department providing 24/7 medical care for both emergency cases and booked out-patient procedures. Diagnostic services are provided by the x-ray and laboratory departments. Visiting respiratory therapists are able to perform spirometry and sleep apnea assessments. Physiotherapy, occupational health, mental health, home care nursing and public health all have offices on site. Visiting specialist services include those for internal medicine, orthopaedic, paediatrics, psychiatry and chiropractic.

The team of specialists covers diverse fields such as obstetrics & gynecology, pediatrics, internal medicine, ophthalmology, neurology, radiology, emergency medicine, and oncology. KLH regularly hosts visiting specialists for general surgery, orthopedics, and urology.

PRINCETON

BRITISH COLUMBIA'S SOUTH OKANAGAN SIMILKAMEEN

Princeton is a small town with a population of 2,894. It is rich as in its history as it's beauty. Ideally situated at the rolling foothills of the Cascade Mountains where the Tulameen and Similkameen Rivers meet, Princeton is the southern gateway to B.C.'s Interior. // PRINCETON GENERAL HOSPITAL

Princeton General Hospital is a six-bed, Level 1 Community Hospital in the Okanagan Health Service Area. Located south west of Penticton, the hospital offers Acute Care, Laboratory, X-ray and 24-hour Emergency Services. In emergency situations this community and physicians are supported by the High Acuity Response Team (HART). HART team consists of dedicated, highly trained critical care nurses responding with a BC Ambulance Service (BCAS) basic life support ambulance team to provide ground or air transport for acutely ill and injured patients from outlying rural and remote communities to higher levels of care. When required, a respiratory therapist will also be called in to assist. This advanced level of support allows the physician to stay in the community while knowing that their critically ill patients are being transported by a team of specialists. HART nurses for this community are based at Penticton Regional Hospital, where they support the Emergency Department and Intensive Care Unit when not involved in patient transports.

Additionally, the local area is served by Cascade Medical Clinic.

WILLIAMS LAKE

BRITISH COLUMBIA'S CENTRAL INTERIOR

Williams Lake is in BC's Central Interior Region, with a population of approximately 11,000 residents locally, and 25,000 residents in the surrounding areas. The people of the Williams Lake First Nation (WLFN), the T'exelcemc, have belonged to the Secwepemc Nation for over 6500 years. Today, the WLFN community includes a growing population of over 800 registered members who live on the traditional lands of T'exelc, in Williams Lake, BC and across the globe. T'exelc is one of 17 Secwepemc nations forming Secwepemculecw, the greater stewardship land area extends from Shuswap Lake, to Quesnel Lake and from Columbia-Kootenay Range, to the Alexis Creek area. Since time immemorial, the Kukpi7s (Chiefs) led a strong people, and continue to do so today.

// CARIBOO MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Cariboo Memorial Hospital is undergoing renovations scheduled for completion in 2026.

Currently a Level 2 Community Hospital with 28 beds, it offers ER, OR, Med-Surgery, Cardiology, and Obstetrics services. The project includes adding 25 beds, upgrading the emergency department, introducing a mental health unit, cancer department, and maternity clinic.
